Kansas City, MO – October 24, 2024: The United States Hispanic Chamber of Commerce's 45th Annual National Conference concluded earlier this month with a clear message: the future of the country's economy is in the hands of the Hispanic business community, specifically Latinas.

For the more than 1,200 attendees, three days of insightful conversations led by industry experts, corporate leaders, and business owners centered around the role of entrepreneurs as innovators in the tech space, the economic vitality of Hispanic businesses, and, more specifically, the impact of Latina entrepreneurs on our national GDP.

Following her appointment as the new USHCC Chair of the Board of Directors, **Jackie Puente, V.P. of External Affairs at Comcast NBCUniversal Telemundo**, reinforced, "Latinas are the backbone of our entrepreneurial spirit, and this conference has spotlighted their innovation, resilience, and the powerful role they play in driving economic prosperity in our communities. I look forward to ushering the USHCC into a new era, leading with the impactful stories of our Hispanic business owners."

Latinas Leading Economic Growth

According to the [U.S. Latina GDP Report](#), "Dando Vida a la Economía," funded by Bank of America, the conference's Corporate Chair Sponsor, lead researchers Dr. Matthew Fineup and Dr. David Hayes-Bautista presented their findings that the nation's Latina population contributes a staggering \$1.3 trillion to the GDP, representing a 51% growth in the past decade.

At the [conference](#), Latinas were present in various facets of the programming, such as:

- **Inspirational keynote addresses and panel discussions** were delivered by **Dr. Antonia Novello**, the first woman and the first Hispanic Surgeon General of the U.S., **Stephanie Parra**, CEO of Arizona's All In Education, and **Mercedes Enrique**, President & CFO at CMS Corporation, a Hispanic-led business doing billions of dollars in federal contracts. Each speaker, reinforced the value of staying close to one's culture while staying committed to the economic improvement of the Hispanic community.
- **Workshops** led by Google, Verizon, WOC Unidas and others, focused on tangible strategies that Hispanic business owners can employ to enhance their operations and foster leadership pipelines for the next generation of Latina entrepreneurs.
- **Business opportunities**, where business owners met with federal agencies, Fortune 500 companies and prime contractors to drive collaboration and innovation. The conference also hosted its Business Expo Hall sponsored by T-Mobile, which included the third edition of Nationwide's Mujeres Mercado, an all-Latina-led market featuring local entrepreneurs from around the country.
